All children have had the opportunity to go on at least one school trip.

Highlights

School trips have included visits to museums, art galleries, Liverpool Empire (Demon Dentist), across Wirral peninsular, Eureka Science museum, The Open, Wimbledon, London and Angelsey.

360 Key Stage 2 children have had swimming lessons. 450 children have participated in wheelchair sports activities. 180 children have experienced acting workshops with a renowned actor covering Bloodbrothers and Shakespeare. Over 100 children have experienced a residential overnight stay.
