
CURRICULUM GUIDE


English

Our literacy sessions will allow children to explore a variety of genres such as: poetry, nonfiction and fiction. We will look at story and letter writing, and creating explanation texts and non-chronological reports.

During our sessions children will be actively developing their writing through specifically improving their grammar, punctuation and vocabulary.







Mathematics Opportunities

The following topics will be covered: problem solving, fractions, decimals, and percentages, rotation and reflection, angles, 2D and 3D shapes, perimeter and area, measures and problem solving, ratio, proportion, data handling, properties and reasoning about numbers.

Reading Opportunities

We will have daily Accelerated Reading sessions and will complete shared reading sessions to help us with developing our reading response strategies. Children will read books which they choose themselves from the class library. The Year 6 Book Spine books are also available for children to select books from—these books are in our classrooms. We will develop our prediction skills and use of inference in response to text. We will also focus on how to summarise information and identify key details to support an opinion and respond to a question.

Social, Moral, Spiritual, Cultural

We will be exploring Christianity and the theme of Promises.

We will complete daily reflective thinking and well-being sessions and we will study 'Families and Friendships' and 'Respecting Others' in PSHE.







Cross Curricular

As artists we will look at South American art exploring the work of Beatriz Milhazez.

As part of our Modern Foreign Languages topic in French, we will study discussions surrounding Families.

In Geography we will study the South American continent. As Historians we will explore the Trans-Atlantic slave trade and the links to Liverpool. We will have a workshop with Eddy Smythe who will discuss how his family was impacted by the slave trade.

In Computing we will look at website design and Coding. We will also continue learn about E-safety.

We will study the work of Benjamin Britten and in Music lessons.

As scientists we will find out about life on earth and the classification system.

P.E. Day is Tuesday for all Year 6 classes. Children should come to school in kit. Please note that this is an essential part of our curriculum. Children must provide a letter, signed by parents, giving a reason for non participation. Children cannot wear jewellery in PE lessons.

Homework

Children are allocated English and Maths homework each week and this homework should be completed by the following Friday of each week.

We encourage all children to read for a short time each night and fill in their reading log (this can also be completed on the Google Classroom log). Books will be used daily as part of the accelerated reading program so it is essential that they are brought to school daily. We ask that children read at least five times a week, they should record this each time they read. They should have at least one parent/carer comment weekly.

If children are struggling with their homework, support can be given during SATs club.
